



Towards the end of June two bus loads of residents went on a scenic drive to have a look at the lake which had been emptied of most of its water.

We drove from the Yacht Club in Yarrawonga out to Denison County Caravan Park in Mulwala before turning around and heading home.

On our journey we noted that the lake starting to refill, yet the Paradise Queen remained stranded on the banks of the lake and amongst the mud.

Did You Know?

+ Yarrawonga Weir was officially opened 50 years after it was built. It was finished in 1939 but the ceremony was postponed because of World War.

Where does the water released from Lake Mulwala go?

- + Water diverted from Lake Mulwala The water is diverted into either the Yarrawonga Main Channel or the Mulwala Canal to irrigators in NSW and Victoria and supports irrigated agricultural production ultimately worth billions of dollars to regional and national economies.
- + During the winter, the water level may vary significantly. The water may be lowered to allow for maintenance or to make way for floodwaters. Recently the lake was lowered to control the spread of Dense Waterweed (Egeria densa).
- + In summer 1000 ML of water evaporates from Lake Mulwala each day. If temperatures reach over 40C and there are strong winds, over 2,000 ML can disappear each day. This equals to a 50 mm reduction in the water level.

Infection Control

Each year we hear or see on the news that there is a flu outbreak somewhere.

Aged Care Facilities, and specifically residents, are particularly vulnerable to outbreaks due to a number of reasons including being older (immune systems weaken as we age), having other illnesses, and the large quantity of people who live in, work at and visit the facility on a daily basis.

The Department of Health and Human Services has recently sent correspondence to all facilities and we include parts of that correspondence here: Dear Residential Aged Care Provider,

I am writing regarding preparation for this year's influenza season. Influenza is one of several common pathogens which cause respiratory outbreaks. It is important to identify outbreaks caused by influenza early, so

that infection c o n t r o l strategies are implemented to reduce the risk of transmission.

An outbreak is defined as three or more residents and/or staff with onset of respiratory symptoms occurring within a 72 hour period. If you become aware of an outbreak, you should immediately notify the Department of Health and Human Services on 1300 651 160.

In preparation for the upcoming influenza season, we recommend that you and your staff review the Victorian Guidelines "Respiratory illness in residential and aged care – Guidelines and information kit",

This information kit is updated annually and Woods Point Aged Care ensures that the policies and procedures are inline with the guidelines in this kit.

Infection Control

In particular the Guidelines recommend that:

1. The single best way to prevent influenza in the residential care setting is for residents and staff members to be vaccinated every year. Influenza vaccine is available now through GPs. Keep a record of all vaccinated staff and residents at your facility. In an outbreak you will be required to report this information to the department.

All residents at Woods Point Aged Care were vaccinated in April. All new residents to the facility are required to provide their most recent vaccination details upon entry.

Woods Point pays for every staff member to be vaccinated annually.

2. In the event of an outbreak. it is highly recommended that designated Outbreak Manage-Team is mentformed, with individuals given specific roles for helping to control the outbreak. You and your staff should make plans now for who is most suitable to fill those roles.

Be assured that Woods Point Aged Care has policies and procedures in place for any such occurrence.

In the event of an outbreak, the following immediate measures are recommended:

1. Implement infection prevention and control strategies, including isolation, hand washing and personal protective

equipment, as per "Respiratory illness in residential and aged care – Guidelines and information kit".

One of the first stages of infection prevention is to discourage unwell visitors.

Signs have been placed at

the facility entry to discourage any visitor who has recently been unwell from entering the facility.

In the event of an outbreak all visitors will be discouraged from entry to assist in limiting the spread of the infection.

During an outbreak Resident movement will be lim-

ited to avoid infected residents coming into contact with others.

Like seasonal influenza, a pandemic strain could occur and would be expected to cause serious ill-

ness, hospitalisation and death in older people.

Standard precautions are preventative measures that must be used at all times in daily work practices to avoid infection and its spread, rather than waiting for the confirmation of an infection.

We encourage our residents and visitors to assist with these standard precautions by covering your coughs and sneezes (preferably with a tissue which is disposed of immediately), practicing good hand hygiene (including the use of hand sanitizer) and avoid being out and about if feeling unwell.

To Lois's husband Ron and family we also extend our condolences.


Birthday


