Residents meeting summary:

Minutes of the April meeting:

Menu/Food: New chef – Sandy has commenced and trialling many different foods. New staff have commenced in kitchen to support the changes in kitchen. Some will work and others may not but continue to provide feedback, special cooked breakfast will now be on Tuesday's.

Covid 19: Regular updates – information about PPE, isolation policy, access to families through skype and face time. Access will also be arranged through Marita and Sam at the front of facility ensuring all guidelines are being met – 1.5 metre social distancing MUST be adhered to at all times. Most are being advised to stay at home so visits are for essential support only.

Aggression towards staff from residents and representatives : Not acceptable and not tolerated. This is completely unreasonable given we are dealing with these challenges. Let's all work together in these difficult times and show some kindness to each other and to the staff.

Valuables and money in rooms : Woods Point cannot take responsibility for valuables and money that goes missing from your room. There is a petty cash system at reception for you to store cash safely and lockable drawers are available for you to store valuables in.

For residents receiving trays in room : If you are able to come out for activities, walks and other meals then you are required to attend breakfast. Trays are for those that are acutely unwell only

Next Resident/ Representative meeting to held: Thursday 7th May 2020 Director of Nursing—Monthly Report

In the context of the COVID-19 pandemic, the community is looking for reassurance that older people receiving aged care will be well looked after and will be kept safe.

Bentley Wood staff are working hard to ensure all consumers care needs including emotional support is being maintained.

Many residents and representatives are very supportive of our actions and we thank you for your positive feedback – understanding our focus is to keep consumers and staff safe from Covid 19 and Influenza.

Bentley Wood has been flexible in their approach to ensure consumers and their representatives are maintaining contact with each other.

Bentley Wood are continuing to allow visitors pre-arranged Monday to Friday with restrictions.

As there are no reception staff on weekends we cannot allow visitors on weekends – unless approved by the DON/DDON prior and on compassionate grounds only.

Visits are not allowed in residents rooms other than special circumstances. An area has been set up for visits to occur.

All visits must be pre booked ensure we are maintaining control practices.

PLEASE adhere to social the protection of residents



to allow us time and space to social distancing and infection

distancing at all times – it is for and staff.

As from 1/5/2020 – prior to any visit, you must show evidence that you have had the 2020 Influenza vaccine. This will need to be shown every time you visit so keep it handy. If you have not had the influenza vaccination then you are not allowed to visit Woods Point.

Immunisation is required for all our contractors before access is allowed

The Aged Care Quality and Safety Commission's current regulatory focus includes:

 Continuing to closely manage complaints about aged care services including those related to COVID-19, and escalating matters for regulatory action based on risk.

• Contacting all aged care approved providers by telephone to monitor their preparation for a COVID-19 outbreak and manage visitor restrictions in line with the Communicable Diseases Network of Australia (CDNA) infection control guidelines and the Australian Health Protection Principal Committee (AHPPC) advice on visits to vulnerable groups including residential aged care services.

• Conducting an online survey of all aged care residential and home care services, asking them key questions about their preparedness for COVID-19 based on the CDNA and AHPPC guidelines;

• Conducting roundtables with provider and consumer representatives to share information about issues and brainstorm solutions;

• Developing resources and tools to assist aged care service providers in responding to the COVID-19 outbreak including posters and letter templates;

developing an approach to directly engage with consumers about their experience of the quality of care and services they are receiving including the impact of the current COVID-19 pandemic.

These provisions are important for protecting residents and staff and reducing the risk of transmission of COVID-19.

Bentley Wood will continue to receive regular updates and ensure compliance with all government guidelines.
